This handbook is a living document. If an incident should arise that is not specifically addressed in this document, the coach and/or school and district administration will address the incident on an individual basis. PISD reserves the right to revise this handbook.

Purpose:

Cheerleading is a vibrant part of the PISD community. For campuses and the community, cheerleading exists in order to promote:

- Tradition
- Spirit
- Ambassadorship

For participants, cheerleading exists to provide students:

- Multiple leadership opportunities
- A sense of team
- Participation in an athletic activity for students with skills in that area
- Opportunities to learn and exhibit sportsmanship and citizenship
- Opportunities to be a role model
- Campus and community ambassadorship

These multiple opportunities help students grow and mature, both physically and emotionally.

Program Membership:

The cheer membership consists of the following people:

- 2 teams: Junior Varsity and Varsity (At this time PISD does not fill a freshman-only squad. Freshman may participate on the JV squad)
- Junior Varsity members may be freshmen, sophomore, or junior girls/boys.
- Varsity members may be sophomore, junior, or senior girls/boys
- Both teams, including any alternate members, will consist of no more than 50 members. A smaller squad may be selected by the coach and administration.
- Cheerleader openings that occur after the official tryouts may be filled by the coaches and campus administration.
- Cheerleaders who move to PISD after the tryout process has been finalized must tryout.
 - Cheerleaders who move in from another district will be evaluated using the same tryout rubric as PISD students.
 - Based on skill evaluation, prior coach evaluation, and current vacancies available, campus coaches and administration will determine placement on team.
- Coaches reserve the right to move cheerleaders from JV to Varsity and from Varsity to JV. Seniors will not be moved to JV at any time.
- Candidates who are injured and unable to demonstrate skills due to injury or illness, may provide video footage for evaluation of skills during the tryout process for the campus. Videos may be of practice, game or competition footage. Video footage should

include tryout skills evaluated: motions, dance, tumbling, stunting and jumps. Video footage should be prior to current injury.

Commitment:

Members of the cheer program will follow the guidelines in this handbook.

Cheer members will serve from the day of selection through the last day of school the following academic year.

- Cheerleaders represent PISD at all times.
- Cheerleading is a year-round commitment that requires devotion of time and effort (see attendance guidelines in this handbook). It is an honor that requires commitment, hard work and dedication.
- PISD cheer commitments should come before other obligations such as jobs, driver education, outside cheer teams, etc.
- Outside commitments will not be considered a reason to miss cheer events. Absences related to outside commitments will receive consequences according to discipline guidelines.
- Each member is required to be in the cheer class. Classes will consist of, but not be limited to, conditioning, preparation for events, tumbling, jumps, and stunting. Physical conditioning may include, but is not limited to, running, weight training, push-ups, crunches, etc.
- Coaches may require supplies for cheer class including, but not limited to, markers, poster board, streamers, tape, etc. With the success of our sports teams, additional supplies may be required.

Tryout Information:

General Information:

- Cheer tryouts will be held in the second semester of the school year.
- Judges are experienced and professional.
 - Judges will be chosen by campus coaches and approved by the campus principal.
 - Judges may be campus specific.
 - Campus coaches will sit on the judging panel of their respective campuses.
 - Judges may include other PISD high school cheer coaches.
- No video taping of any portion of the clinics or evaluation by parents or candidates is permitted.
- Out-going seniors for each campus may be used to teach the tryout material. The senior members may help the entire week of tryouts.
- Try-out material will be specific to the campus.

Before tryouts:

- All candidates and parents must attend the mandatory parent/candidate meeting. Conflicts will be handled on a case by case basis.
- Candidates and parents are responsible for completing, signing, and returning all forms required. These forms must be completed and turned in by the first day of the tryout process. Parents need to read all information carefully and sign forms indicating their understanding of the expectations set forth by campus programs.
- All candidates must have all debts paid to PISD prior to being eligible to tryout.
- All candidates must be in good discipline standing at their respective school (not attending the Opportunity Center or being suspended during tryout process).
- A physical must be turned in prior to the tryout process. Any student who does not have a physical on file with the trainer or has one that is expired must have a new one turned in to the cheer coach by the beginning of the first day of the tryout process.

During tryouts:

- All candidates should report to the designated tryout site on time each day of the tryout process.
- There will be no cell phones allowed in any of the tryout areas. Candidates are asked to leave cell phones at home or in their car. A phone will be available in case of an emergency.
- Clothing for clinic sessions: shorts, t-shirt/tank top, cheer shoes.
- During the tryout process, the following are evaluated: cheer/chant, dance (8 8-counts), jumps, tumbling (running and standing) and stunting.
- During the evaluation portion(s) of the tryout, only the tryout uniform may be worn:
 - Plain white t-shirt/tank top
 - Plain black shorts:
 - 1" white bow, hair in ponytail. For girls that have short hair, hair ½ up with 1" white bow
 - White cheerleading shoes
 - No logos of any kind may be visible on clothing. A 5 point deduction per logo will be taken from your overall score.
- Cheerleaders will be judged using the point values included.
- PISD tryouts and clinics are closed to the public. Parents are asked to drop off their candidate and leave the tryout facility. There will be no areas for parents to wait.

- If candidates have a conflict, emergency or an illness that prevents them from attending a clinic, cheer coaches and campus administration will make arrangements to tryout.

Evaluation Format:

Sessions may be adjusted to allow all candidates the opportunity to learn/practice skills.

Scoring:

Cheer tryout participants will be evaluated on skills using a point system. Each skill is assigned a point value. The maximum point value assigned is considered excellent and the minimum point value assigned is considered below expectations. Stunts and tumbling begin at the lowest skill level and progressively become more difficult. The more difficult the skill, the higher the point value earned. In skills that progressively become more difficult, participants will be asked to perform the most difficult skill they are capable of doing and will be scored accordingly.

Point Values:

Points will be used to compare and rank candidates against one another, but again, coaches will make the final determination on who makes each team/squad.

After tryouts:

- After tryouts coaches will rank candidates based on the points they earned and will use this to guide the decision for placement on each team.
- The results of the tryouts will be posted at a location determined by the campus coaches and administration and communicated to all participants.
- Parents may inquire about their student's tryout results by making an appointment with the cheer coach. Concerns about other students' tryout results, including scores, will not be discussed. The campus is responsible for keeping all documentation regarding the tryout process for one year.
- All decisions regarding teams are made by the campus coaches and administration and are final.
- If an underclassman was previously on the cheer team and does not make the team the following year, the student will be permitted to choose another course.

Cheer Camp:

- Final payment of cheer expenses must be paid in full by the designated due date in order to attend camp with the team.
- Any family who needs special payment arrangements should speak with the campus cheer coach for payment options. Failure to make all timely payments on a payment plan will result in suspension.
- Cheerleaders who do not attend camp may be removed from the team.

Safety:

- Because of the increased athleticism of today's cheerleaders and the complexity of some stunts performed, there is a risk, as in any athletic endeavor, of serious injury.
- All participants must have a current physical form on file prior to participation.
- All participants must be trained and qualified for proper landing and spotting techniques before they are allowed to stunt.
- All participants must go through proper stunt progressions.
- No tumbling or building of stunts is permitted unless a cheer coach is present.
- No horseplay, laughing or general socializing will be permitted during any stunt/practice session.
- Absolutely no jewelry will be worn during practices, games or events, including body piercings.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Leadership

- Cheerleaders represent their school and PISD at all times. They must act as role models and leaders at school and in the community.
- Members will demonstrate good sportsmanship; promote school spirit and display genuine concern for others.

Academics

- Any cheerleader who receives a grade below 70 at the end of the grading period, or fails to meet the standards in his/her Individual Education Plan (IEP) may not participate in extracurricular activities for the allotted time set by the UIL Athletic Eligibility Schedule.
- Any cheerleader who receives a grade below 70 at the end of the grading period in an approved Pre-AP or Advanced Placement class may apply for an eligibility waiver in accordance with PISD guidelines.
- Cheerleaders who are ineligible will be required to practice.
- Any cheerleader who becomes ineligible will not be allowed to perform or travel with the squad for the term of the ineligibility. The coaches will determine if the cheerleader is required to attend an event without participation.
- Any cheerleader who has been ineligible for any two six-weeks grading periods during the school year may be dismissed from the squad.
- A student enrolled in HS Cheerleading may earn up to one credit in physical education.

Attendance and Participation

- Attendance at all games and cheer events is mandatory. This includes but is not limited to practices, fundraising activities, competitions, and pep rallies.
- Planned absences to a game/event/practice/etc. should be requested in writing at least 48 hours in advance. Campus coaches will determine if it will be excused. Inappropriate notification will result in disciplinary action. Examples of excused absences include:
 - Funeral or death in the family
 - UIL or school-related performance or event
- Students who are ill should notify the coach as soon as possible.
- All cheer members are required to attend summer camp, summer practices, and any fundraisers or team activities that are set for the teams in the summer. Cheer members not attending these events are subject to dismissal from the squad.

Financial

- Cost for the year may vary by campus and may vary for returning members, but will not exceed \$950.00 per cheerleader for school costs (Competition costs are additional, including any uniforms, fees, choreography costs, etc.). Items needed vary by campus.
- Estimated cheer cost information:

- Returning members may not need to purchase all items above.
- Other costs throughout the year may develop (team gifts, dinners, player gifts, spirit items, etc.)
- A payment schedule may be set for all payments due.
- Cheer members must be current with their payment schedule. Not being current will result in missing cheer events or games. In the event that a cheer account is not current, suspension from the team may occur. In that case, the cheer member will still be responsible for the amount due to the campus cheer program.
- Cheer members who owe a balance on their account will not be eligible to tryout out for the following year until the amount is paid in full.
- Cheer members are required to attend and participate in all fundraising activities in order to receive credit and be eligible to cheer. Cheer members may also be required to participate in group fundraising activities in which all money earned will be contributed to the general cheer activity fund. Cheerleaders who do not participate or fulfill any quotas set forth by the campus may be considered ineligible to cheer (see *Code of Conduct*).
- All payments should be made to the Campus Activity Fund.
- If a member is declared ineligible, injured, being disciplined, is dismissed or resigns from the team, the member is still responsible for all fees. Refunds will not be issued.

Physical

- Cheerleading is an athletic endeavor. Students must possess the following capabilities necessary for performing the essential functions of a cheerleader:
 - Clear diction, vocal strength, rhythm and coordination
 - Physical moves that may involve jumps, balance, agility and upper and lower body strength
 - Stamina to endure these physical activities through the duration of the games and events
 - Ability to perform routines in both indoor and outdoor settings, in hot and cold weather

Transportation

- The cheer team will ride together as a group to and from all games or activities with coaches. Any extenuating circumstances necessitating other arrangements for transportation must be approved by the coach in advance.

Practices

- The cheer coaches, prior to the last day of school, will determine mandatory summer practices and camp dates and communicate that information to cheerleaders and cheer parents.
- Required team practice time will not exceed 10 hours per week.
- Practice will be held during the cheer class period and before and/or after school and on weekends (Saturdays and Sundays).
- Coaches may assign additional afternoon or morning practices.
- All practices are closed to the public. Parents may come to the last 15 minutes of practice in order to provide transportation for their cheerleader.
- No cell phones are to be used during practice.
- Participants must attend all practices in order to perform at an event (game, pep rally, competition, etc.) Members will be held accountable for an absence, and may be removed from any performance by the campus coach.
- Cheerleaders are expected to arrive on time to practice. Any tardiness may have disciplinary consequences such as additional running, push-ups, or removal from a particular performance.

Captain and Co-Captain:

Captain and co-captain duties (for each team) may include, but are not limited to the following:

Captain responsibilities:

- Taking attendance at cheer functions

- Creating calendars
- Selecting uniforms for events/activities
- Communicating pep rally ideas (Varsity only) and develop agendas for events
- Assigning game responsibilities to team members
- Organizing and distribute all practice schedules and agendas
- Composing cheer, chant and game plans
- Demonstrating a positive and motivating attitude at all times
- Being dependable and cooperative
- Having good organizational skills
- Being on time to all events
- Being responsible for transporting the gift exchange at home games
- Reporting all problems, conflicts and concerns to coaches
- Keeping communication open and flowing with all team members
- Using authority when necessary, but not abusing it

Co-captain responsibilities:

- Support the captain at all times
- Be on time to all events
- Fill in as captain when or if the captain is absent
- Help captain plan and organize pep rallies
- Demonstrate a positive attitude at all times
- Be dependable and cooperative
- Follow campus captain guidelines

Process of choosing captains/co-captains:

- Campus coaches and administration will set cheer captain selection dates.
- Candidates must declare the position for which they are applying (Captain/Co-Captain).
- Captain/Co-Captain candidates may be required to give a 3 minute speech to his/her team about leadership qualities, etc. that they have to offer the program. This may be followed by a group question and answer session that will be directed by the coaches.
- Any additional requirements will be made at the campus level.
- Coaches will make final determination of Captains/Co-captains.

Communication:

Communication is vital for a successful cheer program.

Coaches will communicate:

- Requirements for students and the squad
- Locations, dates, times of practices, games, and events

- Squad requirements including special equipment, uniform, squad rules/regulations, travel arrangements, and off-season expectations

Parents should communicate:

- Concerns regarding a son/daughter directly to the coach at the appropriate time and place
- Issues appropriate for discussion:
 - Student plan for success
 - Student behavior
 - Student safety
- Issues not appropriate for discussion with a coach:
 - Squad selection of cheers, chants, stunts, or elements of a performance
 - Any situation that deals with other students/cheer members

Communication between parent, school and coach:

- If at any time a cheer member or parent feels he/she needs to discuss a problem or complaint, please follow the appropriate channels:
 - Campus cheer coach (set up appointment)
 - Do not confront coach before, during, or after any event.
 - Only enter cheer class with permission from the campus principal or his/her designee.
- If meeting does not provide a satisfactory resolution, parents should then contact the following in this order:
 - Campus Assistant Principal
 - Campus Principal
 - PISD Coordinator of Health, Physical Education and Athletics

Code of Conduct:

A PISD cheer member takes on the role of a respectful and disciplined athlete who should model appropriate behavior for her/his peers at all times-in school, after school, and in the community. This is a very visual position. Along with this position comes a great deal of responsibility; cheerleaders display a good work ethic, and a spirit of cooperation with parents, coaches, other cheerleaders, and other students. Each squad member will be held to these high standards in and out of school. Cheer coaches will determine discipline should infractions occur. This expectation begins the day the member becomes part of the PISD cheer program.

Participants in the PISD Cheer Program will follow a “Three Strike” system. Strikes will be given based on a cheer member’s behavioral infraction. The coaches will document each behavioral infraction and communicate the strikes with cheerleader and parent at the time of the infraction.

Any cheer member who is removed from the cheer program during the school year will be moved from the cheer class to a physical education class in order to earn the P.E. credit for the semester. Any student who is removed from the program for grade or behavior strikes must submit a formal request to tryout for the cheer program for the following year. Appeals will be granted on a case-by-case basis determined by a PISD cheer coach and administrator.

The following levels outline discipline infractions and possible consequences. All discipline is designed to be corrective in nature.

The following behaviors/circumstances may lead to a temporary suspension from the cheer program:

- Inability to perform at an event due to long term or catastrophic health conditions
- Ineligibility due to academic non-compliance (first time only)

Level I: (these infractions do not incur strikes)

Immediate reminders: The cheer coach will determine the reminder and consequence at the time of the infraction. Consequences for Level I behaviors may result in reminders, physical conditioning, or suspension for part of a game/event. The list below includes examples of some behaviors which would require immediate reminders:

- Tardiness to practice or class
- Incorrect practice clothes (including hair bows, if applicable)
- Incorrect game uniform (including hair bows)
- Wearing jewelry at inappropriate times
- Chewing gum, eating candy, or snacking during a game, practice, or an event without permission
- Being disruptive, horsing around, or talking excessively at inappropriate times
- Failing to fully participate in fundraising activities
- Failure to bring designated materials when required (including supplies for cheer class)
- Failure to help paint, hang, or remove signs when assigned
- Failure to turn in paperwork or project money

Level II: (These infractions incur strikes)

The cheer coach will determine if a strike is warranted by the cheerleader's behavior. Strikes may result in the same consequences as a level I infraction, along with the strike itself. Any of the following may result in a strike:

- Disrespect/insubordination toward cheer coach
- Disrespect/insubordination toward a teacher or administrator
- Disrespect/inappropriate language toward other team member
- Absence to a game/practice/event
- Leaving a practice/game/event without permission
- Unsportsmanlike conduct at a game or event
- Talking or texting on cell phone during game/practice event
- Academic dishonesty
- Assignment to ISS
- Receiving a discipline referral
- Not participating in mandatory fundraising activities
- Repeatedly (more than three times) being tardy to a practice/game/event
- Repeatedly receiving "reminders" for Level I
- Being assigned Saturday school

Level III: (These infractions result in removal from the team)

- Suspension from school
- Receiving three strikes
- Assignment to the Opportunity Center
- Failing any two six week grading periods
- Alcohol Use
- Drug Use
- Smoking
- Destruction or vandalism of school property
- Stealing

Violations of the Student Code of Conduct will also be handled by campus administration in conjunction with the PISD cheer discipline process.

Lettering:

In order for a member of the Varsity cheer team to receive a letter or patch and qualify to purchase a jacket, he/she must:

- Remain academically eligible
- Remain in good standing
- Perform in all required events
 - An unexcused absence for any event/game/performance excludes cheerleaders from earning a jacket.

If a member is removed from the cheer program or resigns his/her position, he/she will not be eligible to earn a jacket.

If at any time a cheerleader has received three strikes, he/she will not be eligible for "lettering" status and/or the cheer banquet at the end of the year.

Competition:

High schools may have a competitive program as determined by the campus coaches and administration. All PISD cheerleaders will have the opportunity to tryout for their high school's competitive team. A cheerleader must be a member of the school's regular cheer team in order to be considered eligible to tryout for the competitive team. Competitive squads will adhere to PISD Cheer guidelines. Additional requirements may be imposed.

- The campus will set competitive practices.
- The campus will determine competition locations and dates.
- The PISD competitive cheer team will not attend more than 6 competitions within a school year.
- The campus coaching staff may divide and level the teams.
- Campus coaches may make changes to any routine/performance as necessary (illness, injury, attitude, disciplinary concerns).

All costs/fees of competition are in addition to school cheerleading fees. If cheerleaders choose to compete, they will be required to pay all fees regarding competition. If the cheerleader is academically ineligible or has been subject to disciplinary action, he/she is still required to pay all competition fees. Fees must be paid in advance. Cheerleaders will not be able to perform until all fees are paid.

PISD Cheerleader Agreement

We understand that we are required to attend the mandatory parent/candidate meeting at our respective campus on the date listed in the appendix. We understand that cheerleader candidates are required to attend all practice and tryout sessions.

We have read this PISD Cheerleading Handbook and we understand that the candidate must comply with all expectations if selected to the team.

Tryout paperwork, including the physical, is due by the first day of the clinic. We have initialed the squad selection and understand that the candidate will only be considered for the team(s) initialed.

We understand that if jewelry is worn that a 5 point overall deduction will be taken per item of jewelry worn.

We understand that a panel of judges (including campus coaches and outside experts) will evaluate candidates. Point value scores contained herein will be used as guidelines. Following skill evaluations, judges will rank candidates. The campus cheer coaches and principal will determine team members.

We understand that all candidates will be judged on stunting during the tryout process. Candidates may be asked to change stunting positions to see adaptability. Candidates may choose which stunt to be scored on, however, if selected for the team, this may not be the position on the team. Campus coaches will determine stunt position.

We understand that video taping of any portion of the tryout process by parents or candidates is not permitted.

We understand that there are financial obligations that are required if selected as part of the PISD Cheer Program. We understand that payment is mandatory, and expected to be on time.
